## letter from the policy & advocacy committee.

Citizens Project was founded in 1992 to defend the rights of LGBTQ+ people and preserve the separation of church and state, and over the years we have expanded our mission to encompass a broader commitment to equity, inclusion, and justice. We analyze policy with a sharp eye on issues likely to hold special interest for constituents in El Paso County.

To that end, we've produced this report card on the voting record of the El Paso County delegation to the Colorado General Assembly, and present this visual summary of members' alignment with our organization's policy priorities.

There are four possible ways a legislator's vote could be scored:

- They voted in alignment with Citizens Project
- They did not vote in alignment Citizens Project
- They were excused from the vote
- The vote never came across their desk. These records will be blacked out as "not applicable." This does not indicate either absence or avoidance by a legislator, simply that the bill never came up in their respective chamber or a committee on which they serve.

# legislative session overview.



Citizens Project engages in legislative monitoring to advance its mission of promoting equity, inclusion, and justice through civic engagement and advocacy.

Monitoring the policymaking process at the state level is just one way that we promote transparency and accountability, educate and empower the community, advocate for inclusive public policy, and strengthen civic engagement.



A total of 657 bills were introduced this session.

Out of those, 488 passed both chambers.

Citizens Project monitored 87 bills, and took positions on 63, with a key focus on 6 priority bills that impact key constituencies.



Most legislation had bipartisan support.

Of all the bills that passed this session:

13% passed unanimously in both chambers,

87% gained bipartisan support in at least one chamber, and

61% had bipartisan sponsorship



Citizens Project supported 79% (22 bills) of the El Paso county delegation's sponsored bills, showing strong alignment with the El Paso delegation's agenda.

**82**% of bills Citizens Project supported successfully passed, reflecting strong alignment with legislators and responsiveness to community interests.



## citizens project's priority bills

# SB25-001: Colorado Voting Rights Act (COVRA)

link to full bill.

The bill protects the right of all racial, ethnic, and language minority groups to have equal access to the voting process, just like the Federal Voting Rights Act says. Cities and counties must make sure elections are fair for everyone. The bill explains some election practices that would break voting rights laws. It also creates a way for people to take legal action if those rights are violated.

Citizens Project strongly supports this bill because it removes structural and language barriers to voting, like examining the impacts of April municipal elections in underrepresented communities, and ensures local election systems reflect the diversity and rights of all Coloradans. This bill is a powerful step toward building a democracy that is truly inclusive and representative.

# HB25-1321: Support Against Adverse Federal Action

link to full bill.

The bill gives \$4 million to the Governor's Office from a special fund in the 2025-26 budget. The money can be used until the end of the 2026-27 budget year. It will help the state respond to actions taken by the federal government that affect Colorado. This includes hiring workers or contractors, paying for legal help, and covering other costs to protect the state's rights and funding. The Governor's Office is also allowed to accept gifts, grants, and donations to help with these efforts. Any money that isn't used by July 1, 2028, will go back to the state's main fund.

Citizens Project supports this bill because it enables Colorado to protect vital federal funding, defend inclusive state policies, and respond quickly and legally to federal threats — all of which help preserve equity, justice, and essential public services that matter deeply to Citizens Project and the communities we serve.

## citizens project's priority bills

# SB25-276: Protect Civil Rights Immigration Status

#### link to full bill.

Citizens Project joins numerous civil rights and immigration advocates to support this bill, which broadens prohibitions against state law enforcement from cooperating or sharing data with federal immigration officers, as well as eases access to public facilities and in-state tuition for undocumented immigrants.

We believe that the passage of this bill defends the full humanity of every resident by aligning Colorado law with principles of due process and privacy, protecting vulnerable individuals from unjust detainment and/or deportation, and assisting in building trust between immigrant communities and public institutions, such as schools and hospitals.

SB25-063: Library Resource Decision
Standards for Public Schools

link to full bill.

This bill says that local school boards and the Charter School Institute (CSI) must create clear rules for how school library books and other materials are chosen, kept, and removed.

Citizens Project sees book bans and control efforts as threats to democratic values, inclusive education, and freedom of thought – all of which are central to its mission.

## citizens project's priority bills

# SB25-005: Worker Protection Collective Bargaining

#### link to full bill.

Right now, workers can vote to form a union if more than half of them agree. But if they want to add a special rule called a union security agreement (which may require all workers to pay a fee), they have to hold a second vote with at least 75% approval. This bill would remove the need for that second vote, making the process easier.

Citizens Project supports this bill because it removes an unfair barrier to union effectiveness, empowers workers — especially those from marginalized communities — to advocate for better conditions, and promotes economic and racial justice. It affirms the principle that a simple majority vote should be enough to secure meaningful collective bargaining rights.

## HB25-1312: Legal Protections for Transgender Individuals (Kelly Loving Act)

#### link to full bill.

The Kelly Loving Act expands legal protections for transgender individuals through several measures, including expanded anti-discrimination policies, educational guidelines that require schools to adopt policies regarding chosen names and dress codes, allowing for people to change their gender marker on state-issued IDs without the need for a court order, and protecting parents and families that choose to pursue gender affirming care for their children.

Citizens Project has long been a vocal advocate for equity and inclusion, especially for marginalized groups. We view these protections as crucial steps toward ensuring trans people can live safely and authentically, and supporting this bill directly aligns with our commitment to both healing justice and preventing future harm through policy change.
